Susan G. Komen was founded in 1982 by Nancy Brinker to honor her sister, Susan G. Komen, who died of breast cancer at age 36. Nancy promised her sister, Suzy, that she would do everything in her power to end breast cancer. Founded in 1996, the Charlotte affiliate is one of 122 across the nation, with three international affiliates in Italy, Germany and Puerto Rico. Komen Charlotte focuses on breast health education, screenings, diagnostic services, and treatment support for uninsured and underinsured people in a 13-county service area. In York County, S.C., Komen Charlotte supports BEST CHANCE NETWORK that provides screenings and diagnostic services to low-income individuals, including the Catawba Indian Nation Reservation.
