

Sand Lot Beach Tournament Series Covid 19 Protocols

*Derived from USA Volleyball's "Return to play" guidelines and the CDC and local authorities.

1. All players, managers, spectators, and staff must do daily symptom self-assessment. Anyone experiencing symptoms must stay home.
2. Mask use: Wearing of masks by players/staff during games is permitted but not required. Ever though we are outdoors, it is highly recommended that spectators wear masks.
3. Upon entering the facility, all players will wash their hands. Teams should have their own hand sanitizer and must use it before and after each set. *The site will provide hand sanitizer for all players and staff and disinfectant for the game balls.
4. The teams will not share warm-up balls; Sand Lot BTS will provide a disinfected warm-up ball for each team and the SLBTS will encourage teams to disinfect the ball prior to each warm-up for the set.
4. The reffing team will sanitize the game ball before each game begins.
5. There will be NO BLOCKING this season in any sand VB league.
6. Winning team records each game score on the scoresheet. The tournament director will record the score and will log and track the win/loss record for each team.
8. All teams warming-up for the next match will remain 6ft apart during warm up. Players finishing a set should move away from the court area quickly so that the next teams can get on the court. Teams must take all trash with them.
9. It is recommended that players limit bringing spectators, especially children. Children also may not be present without a non playing adult to supervise them. Spectators can bring their own chairs, sit physically distant from other spectators not in their own household, and may not enter the court.
10. No team handshakes before / after sets (a 'friendly wave'). Physical distancing should be maintained during side changes
11. Rock / paper/ scissors done from 6' apart at the net. No high fives or team "huddles" - step back some to talk.
12. The restrooms have been cleaned and disinfected, but you will use them at "your own risk.
